God's Work in Ministering (Psalm 34:11-18)

QUESTIONS FOR SMALL GROUP DISCUSSION AND PERSONAL REFLECTION:

1. Psalm 34:18 says that God is near to the brokenhearted. Where else is that idea in scripture? (If you don't have any examples come to mind, search for words like "Brokenhearted," "poor in Spirit," or "lowly.") Why do you think the Bible re-iterates this point so often?
2. Have you ever experienced what Psalm 34:18 is talking about (and what Jenn and Ryan experienced)? Do you have a time where God showed up clearly in your life in the middle of suffering?
3. Aaron re-iterated the point that the Bible is more interested in telling us where God is in our suffering, rather than why God allows that suffering. Why does this idea matter in your life? What difference does this way of thinking about suffering make?
